



# Important Notices for the Quarter:

## ♦ Snow Removal

Residents are responsible for removal of snow and ice from the sidewalks. If you have a snow blower, we ask that you do not blow snow into the street. Residents have 24 hours after the snow has stopped falling to remove snow and ice from sidewalks. If you are not currently living in Paullina for the winter, you are still responsible for the removal of snow. Take caution and be courteous of the city workers as they remove snow. If they are in equipment, give them space to clear the streets so the road conditions can return to normal!

## ♦ Parking in Alleys

During winter, it is difficult for the city workers to make it through the alleys when vehicles are not appropriately parked. If you park your vehicle in an alley, please ensure your vehicle is out of the way so the plows can easily pass through to clear the snow. If the plows cannot make it through the alley, it will not be cleared!

## Notices

- ♦ Effective November 1, 2023 through March 31, 2024 per Ordinance Title IV-Chapter 1:Traffic Code-Article 5.09. No Parking on any street from November 1, 2023 through March 31, 2024 between the hours of 2a.m. to 6a.m. Except in the business district where the hours of no parking is between 3a.m. and 5a.m.

## Garbage Cans and Recycling Cans

---

- ◆ Please take care of your blue garbage cans and gray recycling cans! If a can is not well maintained and gets damaged, it is the resident's responsibility to replace the can!
- ◆ Be cautious of where you set your cans on the curb when there is snow on the ground. Ensure you are setting the can on the curb and not on the street! This will help keep your can from getting knocked over by a snow plow passing by.
- ◆ As always, be sure to set out and return cans promptly after pick-up.

## Emergency Calls to the On-Call Phone

- ◆ The city workers are on call to help residents when they are in need after hours!
- ◆ The city workers are able to help residents when you do not have water/power, sewer not draining properly, a tree in the road, a power line down, etc.
- ◆ They are not able to help with furnace problems, plow resident driveways, fix breaker boxes, repair indoor plumbing, etc.
- ◆ If you have any questions, please give the city a call or stop by the office!

Any resident may stop by the city office and fill out a complaint form for any type of complaint they may have. This includes all city employee complaints including police/fire/ambulance/library, complaints about ordinances, complaints about nuisances, etc. These forms must be filled out before the city can take action to resolve the problem. Thank you!
