- 2. Be concise and limit comments to five (5) minutes. You may not save your time for later or yield the remainder of your time to someone else. After speaking, please be seated.
- If you are addressing a matter on the agenda, state the agenda item you are speaking about and if you are speaking on more than one agenda item, arrange your comments in chronological order.
- 4. Try not to duplicate information that has already been presented.
- 5. Direct comments to the entire Council and not to an individual. Questions and issues raised during this time will generally not be answered during this time.
- 6. Maintain a courteous and respectful manner.
- 7. If you are the presenter on an item which has been formally placed on the Council agenda, this public forum process does not apply, although you are asked to be succinct in your presentation.
- 8. Iowa law requires certain matters to have public hearings, which have their own comment periods. Comments pertaining to a public hearing item should be saved for that item, and the five-minute comment period will also apply for public hearings.

### Paullina City Council Minutes 03/17/2025

The Paullina City Council met in regular session on Monday, March 17th, 2025, at 5:30 pm in the Council Chambers, City Hall, 127 South Main St, Paullina, Iowa. Mayor Marlin Sjaarda called the meeting to order at 5:30 pm. Roll Call was taken. Council Members present: Steve Heeren, Dennis Werkmeister, Jean Unrau, Nichole Jacobs and Carol Honkomp. Staff present: Utility Superintendent Kelly Top, City Clerk Michelle Wilson, Police Chief Nathan Bremer, and Library Director Matt Dengler. Guests: Krayton Struve, Marcus Faust, Kent Faust, Katie Lange, Matthew Zwart and Merlin Zwart. Press: Radtke

Motion by Jacobs, second by Honkomp to approve agenda. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Unrau, second by Heeren to approve the consent agenda with the following items: Approve minutes from 3/3/25 regular City Council meeting. Approve payment of claims and pre-approved claims. Approve Mill Creek Liquor. All ayes. Motion carried.

Kent and Marcus Faust presented the Council with the liability and property insurance renewal. Faust will put together a break-down of costs showing the premium changes with higher deductibles. Motion by Heeren, second by Werkmeister to approve the insurance renewal. All ayes. Motion carried.

Katie Lange, representing the Chamber of Commerce, presented the Council with information on Food Truck Monday. This will start on May 5<sup>th</sup> and go through September and will be located at the City Park.

Motion by Unrau, second by Honkomp to approve Food Truck Mondays. All ayes. Motion carried.

FFA will be having a Tractor Parade in celebration of National Ag Week and the Chapter's 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary. The parade will start at 8:00 am at the Paullina American Legion. It will travel across HWY 10 to Wood St, south to Commerce St, west to Main, south on Main St to Bertha where it will make a loop in Zion St John's Church parking lot. They will then head north on Main St to Groesbeck, west to S Willow St and travel the square around the school building. The parade will obey all traffic signs and traffic laws. Motion by Werkmeister, second by Unrau to approve the Tractor Parade route. All ayes. Motion carried.

Purchase and installation of downtown streetlights was discussed. The City will look into possible grants to help cover the cost before making a decision to move forward.

Matthew Zwart from Joiner and Zwart Dentistry and Merlin Zwart representing JZD Properties, LLC were present to submit an offer on the property located at 108 E Groesbeck St. Matthew Zwart explained to the Council how excited Joiner and Zwart Dentistry is to have Krayton Struve as part of their practice. Dr. Struve plans to make Paullina her permanent home and is ambitious to grow her dental practice. The current location does not allow for the growth that Dr. Struve anticipates. Dr. Struve, along with JZD Properties LLC, plan to make modifications to the property at 108 E Groesbeck, which are needed to help facilitate the growth of the practice.

Motion by Unrau, second by Honkomp to approve Resolution No.2025-09 to authorize the City of Paullina to enter into contract and convey real estate owned by the City of Paullina, and setting a public hearing to be held in the Council Chambers in the City Hall at 6:00 pm on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2025, at which time the Council will hear any objections to the proposed resolution and the proposed sale from any interested party. The Clerk is directed to publish notice of the hearing in conformance with State Law. Roll call vote was taken. All ayes, Motion carried.

Clerk Wilson informed the Council of a program offered by People for Pets from Spencer. This program would offer assistance in handling the stray/feral cat issue. This program will help trap, alter and re-home feral cats located in Paullina. This program is of no cost to the City. A representative from the program plans to attend the April 7<sup>th</sup> City Council meeting to supply more information and answer any questions. Motion by Honkomp, second by Jacobs to approve utilizing the services offered by People for Pets at no cost to the City. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Werkmeister, second by Heeren to approve Pay Estimate No.1-Electrical Distribution Improvements in the amount of \$156,782.64. All ayes. Motion carried.

Superintendent of Utilities Top informed the Council of the meeting with the Swanson Commission. More meetings will take place to continue the discussion of the City's future involvement. Clerk Wilson advised the Council that she has been working on the budget and preparing for the annual exam. Mayor Sjaarda voiced his excitement in moving forward with the sale of the property at 108 E Groesbeck St. Library Director Matt Dengler updated the Council on the new quote to replace the HVAC at the Library. The new quote is just under \$25,000, and they are looking at possible funding options. Motion by Heeren second by Unrau to adjourn at 6:25 pm. All ayes. Motion carried.

The Hansen's behind us love listening and watching our ducks play. The lady down the street loves coming over to watch them. The guy behind us gets eggs from us. Our ducks are quiet compared to the chickens and dogs that live around us. The only time I hear them is when someone is in the alleyway. We have 6 ducks. Not sure why now you guys are acting on them now. We had them all summer and fall. Our neighbors will glady tell you how great our birds are and healthy. Ducks have just as much benefits as chickens.

Michelle,

I see per Title III, Section 8.01.17 Farm Animals & Fowl that ducks are considered a nuisance animal and only allowed in areas zoned Agriculture.

There is no variance process or waiver process. The way to address this is for the City Council to amend the City Code to allow for Ducks. Similar to the City amending the Code to allow for Chickens as in Section 10.34 Chickens of Title III. The City could add Ducks to this provision or create a separate section to address allowing ducks. This is a City Council issue and would require amending the code to allow for Ducks.

Here is what I recommend: We have no idea how bad the property is on the inside. I think we need to ask the Court for an administrative search warrant. This will allow us to enter the property with a contractor and ascertain what exactly is needed to bring the property to habitability. After that is determined, we can approach Mr. Ngeleka about agree to a timeline on the stated repairs — missing these timelines will result in a monetary fine to Mr. Ngeleka. If Mr. Ngeleka is not interested in coming to an agreement that is suitable to the City Council, the City should file a Petition for Abandoned Property. The most likely outcome of this situation is that Paullina will take possession of the property.

I am writing to follow up on the telephone call you and I had recently regarding the letter the City of Paullina sent requesting you to abate the nuisances at your property on Broadway St. As the letter stated, the City has ordinances prohibiting the existence of nuisances on residential property of which you have many. I have spoken to the City Council and outlined below exactly what needs to be done to this property to make it acceptable. If the nuisances below are not addressed and handled by May 1, 2025, and you have not requested a hearing before the City Council by said date, the City is fully prepared to utilize its legal resources and take further action. If the City has to go this route, you will be cited and fined a minimum of \$750, and the City may declare this home abandoned and take possession of it.

- > Trailer full of junk, scrap materials

Wow... I wish I would have thought to put something like this on our notice! Ever since we posted the Public Hearing Notice on our Facebook page, our residents are in an uproar thinking their taxes are going way up, even though we are levying for LESS tax dollars this year and our tax rate actually went DOWN. The forms are hard to understand and they see those numbers at the bottom of the form and are instantly irate! I emailed Ted at Department of Management about this.

Here is my conversation with Ted-

Me-

"Hi Ted,

Can you explain to me what the bottom portion of this form means? We are levying for LESS money than we did last year (last year was \$201,579 and next year is \$192,968 due to having a buildup of funds in our Employee Benefits fund so not levying anything for those this time) and thus our tax rate has gone from 15.36 to 14.38, but people are seeing whats on the bottom of this form and thinking our rates are going up by 5.48% residential and 6.78% comercial. I even put "No Increase" at the very bottom where it says to list the reasons for tax increase if proposed exceeds the current, but they only see the increase of 5.48 and 6.78 and think we are raising their taxes."

#### Ted-

"Katie -

The growth of value in the example from \$100K for FY25 to \$110K for FY26 is the source of the growth. The examples at the bottom of the property tax hearing notice has a built in 10% increase in property value, which is why your examples still show an increase. If someone in your city has a property that did not grow in actual / assessed value (this year that will mean most homeowners), they will see the same amount as last year or a reduction in city tax."

#### Me-

"So that area of the form has nothing to do with anything I entered into our Budget forms? It is very confusing to people having that on the form when it has nothing to do with the taxes the city is levying against our residents."

#### Ted-

"Katie -

The property tax examples are still related to what you enter in for a property tax request. The example uses your proposed property tax rate. This is an example that is required to be on the mailing by law. To get it changed or removed you may want to work with your representative / senator."
